Transportation fees _____

It is required that campers who bring spending money would leave the money in an account at the office (during registration) to avoid any unnecessary misunderstandings. Campers would be able to draw off of their account for the snack shop, or other needs that they would have. Any remaining funds would be returned to the camper at the end of the week.

Campers are expected to follow the guidelines of the camp, and to be respectful of their fellow campers and staff. We believe that each camper is entitled to be able to enjoy his/her time at camp.

We feel that the safety of each camper is vitally important. Each camper is expected to be with his/her counselor at all times. Those bringing guide dogs are expected to have baggies with them to clean up after your guide.

If you are bringing a personal service worker, this person needs to register by completing the registration form and returning it to the same mailing address. Reminder to those travelling by bus/train to purchase round-trip tickets to/from Oxford NS.

Registration is at **4:00 pm** on **Sunday June 24, 2018**. Campers may be registered in the order in which the registration forms are received in the Moncton office. Should you need to arrive early, lunch can be arranged with the camp cook for a cost of \$10.00 per person.

Please be sure to bring your first aid station check list sheet with you to registration.

On **Friday June 29**, campers should be **packed up** by **7:30 am** (before breakfast) and prepared to go home by **9:00 am**. Those taking the bus will leave the campgrounds by 9:30 am. Transportation fees from the bus/train station in Oxford NS to Camp Pugwash/ return is \$15.00, payable on June 24 (a support worker will collect these cash funds from you on the bus). All luggage should be clearly labelled/tagged with your name. We do not provide supervision of campers after this time.
